DYSLEXIA AWARENESS MONTH



WHAT IS DYSLEXIA?

Dys = difficulty and lexis = word so dyslexia literally means "difficulty with words". Dyslexia is an **unexpected difficulty** in reading in an individual who has the intelligence to be a much better reader.

WHAT ARE SOME SIGNS OF DYSLEXIA?

- Difficulty pronouncing words
- Difficulty following directions and confusion with before/after, right/left, up/down, etc.
- Difficulty learning the alphabet, nursery rhymes or songs
- Difficulty understanding concepts and relationships
- Struggle with word retrieval or naming problems
- Difficulty identifying or generating rhyming words or counting syllables
- Difficulty with hearing and manipulating sounds in words
- Difficulty distinguishing between different sounds in words
- Difficulty learning the sounds of letters
- Difficulty with decoding and fluency
- Difficulty putting ideas on paper
- Many spelling mistakes
- Struggles with proofreading
- Letter reversals
- Avoidance of reading/writing tasks



HOW CAN I SUPPORT A STUDENT WITH DYSLEXIA?

Orton-Gillingham is known as the gold standard in working with students with dyslexia. It uses a structured, multisensory approach and meets each child exactly where they are. It is emotionally sound and respects the cognitive abilities of the student. All of our tutors have received their certification (or are training to receive certification) from the Orton-Gillingham Academy (OGA).

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



Our tutors have been hard at work getting to know each of their students and planning specifically for them. My favorite aspect of the OG approach is how tailored it is for each child. We move at the child's pace, use the errors they made in the lesson to determine what to teach in the next lesson, and write sentences/stories based on the student's interests, using only words with skills that they have been taught, ensuring an emotionally sound, successful experience in each session.
