NEXT STEPS FOR DONATION-BASED OG STUDENTS

The school year is winding down and our Orton-Gillingham trainees are wrapping up their required 100 hours of tutoring for their practicum. They are busy preparing their applications to submit to the Orton-Gillingham Academy so that they can obtain their associate level OG certification. We are proud of the work they have done as well as all the progress their students have made.

But now you may be thinking: my child has finished their 100 hours, what's next? We have a few options available for you:

- 1. Summer Intensive** - This year we are offering 2 sessions of our summer program (3 weeks each) with small groups of students. The goal is to prevent summer regression in a fun, relaxed atmosphere. (summer session 1: July 11th-29th, summer session 2: August 1st-19th) You can sign up for one or both sessions. Each session meets Mon-Fri 9:15 am-12:00 pm. The summer program includes a daily OG lesson, arts & crafts, games, snack time, and gross motor activities/sports. All activities are related to the OG concepts being studied. Students will be grouped based on age/ability level. The summer program is \$1920 per 3 week session. Space is limited; please submit an application ASAP.
- 2. Small Group Instruction** - This gives children the opportunity to work with their peers and continue to improve their literacy skills in a small group setting 2x a week (September through June) This program is contingent upon enrollment and only open to students who have completed the 100 hour practicum and has a \$50 per session rate. Once we receive enough applications from students, we will match students with others at similar levels and with similar schedules and confirm the days and times that the small group will meet.
- 3. Fee-based Tutoring** - Work 1:1 with a trained practitioner; the number of sessions per week is flexible and can be in-person or virtual. Space is limited so please submit an application ASAP. Students who have completed their 100 hour practicum are offered a discounted rate of \$100 per session for fee-based tutoring. (If you have a household income of \$75,000 or less, we encourage you to complete a financial aid application. You can contact Anne-Marie at apoliviou@literacynassau.org to request a financial aid application packet.)
- 4. School District Contracts** - We also have tutors available during the school day if your district is interested in contracting with us to provide 1:1 OG tutoring in the school. We are currently booking for the fall so districts should contact us now to create a contract and schedule for the fall. This service is billed to the district at our regular fee-based rate of \$150 per session.

Orton-Gillingham (OG) based instruction will be incorporated through multisensory games, arts and crafts, and a variety of other indoor/outdoor activities. This summer program is designed for students who are 6-12 years old and are identified with dyslexia or who otherwise struggle with reading, writing, and spelling.

Students will be in small groups based on their age/ability level. Lessons and activities are guided by teachers who are certified through the Orton-Gillingham Academy (OGA).

Daily Schedule:

- OG-based reading/writing lesson
- Snack break
- OG-based game, craft, or activity
- Lesson Review/Read Aloud

Tuition: \$1,920 (cash/check)
\$1,960 (credit) per session.

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
